This required training explains all the parts of North Carolina's SIDS Law. Participants will review information about when and how to use the approved waivers, how to best place a baby in bed to sleep, and other "Best Practice" recommendations. During the workshop, participants will get the needed information to create a Safe Sleep Policy, updated research about SIDS, and local health and safety resources. Participants also receive a walk-through on how to do an unresponsive infant drill and the importance for doing them regularly.

WEBINAR- STOP, LOOK & LISTEN: How to Observe and Assess Infant Toddler Development

You spend your days caring for the children in your program, but do you really get to observe them? And when you have those moments to observe, do you know what to do with all the information that you collect? During this 2-part webinar we will address the benefits of observing, offer techniques for taking objective observations, and introduce some tools that can be used while observing. Participants will be required to use some of the tools and techniques discussed to do an observation of a child between sessions. We will discuss what an assessment is and is not, what types of assessments are available, the reason for doing an assessment and what to do with the results of an assessment.

Using the observation data collected in the earlier part of the training, participants will complete a practice assessment of the child and have the opportunity to get feedback from the instructor and the other webinar participants as to how to use the results to support the child's learning and development.

Reggio Emilia Online Training Opportunity

Exploring the Reggio Emilia Approach to Early Childhood Education: Inquiry-Based Curriculum

Course Dates:

Asynchronous class opens (online, in Blackboard LMS) March 16, 2019 and closes April 4, 2019

3-30-19: Field Trip to Hillsborough, NC

This is one of a series of four courses related to the Reggio Emilia approach. Other courses focus on Documentation, Image of the Child, and Getting Started with Reggio Emilia. These classes do not have to be taken in sequence.

In this class, students explore the origin and features of the Reggio Emilia approach, with a focus on Inquiry-Based Curriculum. Students explore the philosophy as well as Reggio-inspired practices. Learning is enhanced through a mandatory field trip to a Reggio-inspired school and post-field trip reflections. Students will need to provide their own transportation.

Objectives:

- Discuss the origin of the Reggio Emilia approach to early childhood education.
- Identify several features of the Reggio Emilia approach to early childhood education.
- Discuss one school's efforts to engage with the Reggio Emilia approach to early childhood education.
- Identify features of inquiry-based curriculum.
