7/17/18 & 7/24/18

Managing Challenging Behaviors Training Series: Module 1 of 3 – The Power of Positive Relationships (Must attend both sessions and strongly encouraged to attend all 3 modules)

Using the CSEFEL Pyramid Model, this module we'll explore attitudes about challenging behaviors and the range of factors that influence a child's behavior. We will define the relationship between social emotional development and children's behavior, learn a framework to enhance social emotional competence, and focus on positive relationships as the crucial foundation of children's ability to learn.

Partnering with Families to Address Challenging Behaviors: We are all in this together!

When a child uses challenging behaviors at school, parents and teachers need to work together to address the issue. However, when discussing behavior problems, parents often feel blamed by the teachers and teachers often feel unsupported by the parents. This session focuses on developing strategies and skills to make these conversations more productive for everyone...especially the child!

Temperament of Infants & Toddlers: Understanding & Supporting Individual Differences

Are you distractible or persistent, sensitive or easy going? These characteristics describe temperament. During this workshop, we'll learn about traits used to describe most infants and toddlers. We will also discuss "goodness of fit" between your own temperament and the infants and toddlers in your care and explore the role of culture as it relates to temperament.

Emergency Preparedness & Response in Child Care (EPR)

It is very important that every effort is made to ensure your child care facility is prepared and your staff are ready to respond appropriately during a disaster. Participants will establish a plan and learn how to be prepared for a variety of emergency situations. Rules for this training became effective July 1, 2015.

8/7/18

Building a School Family: Starting Your Year the Brain Smart Way (Conscious Discipline®)

A positive school climate is necessary for developmentally-appropriate discipline strategies. In this workshop, you will learn how to build the school-family using rituals, literature, activities and the physical environment.

8/14/18

Secret Service: The In's and Out's of Service Projects with School-Age Kids!

In this workshop, we will discuss how children can serve others and have fun doing it, from simple things you can do on your own to large-scale commitments that unite the community. Who says that you have to wait until you're an adult to change the world?

8/16/18 & 8/23/18

Managing Challenging Behaviors Training Series: Module 2 of 3 – The Environment as a Second Teacher (Must attend both sessions and strongly encouraged to attend all 3 modules)

Is your classroom ready for an extreme makeover? The environment impacts behavior, and you control the environment – come learn how to make that environment work for you in taming challenging behaviors. Teachers will have the opportunity to assess their own classroom environment and create a guided action plan.

8/20/18

Connecting the NC Foundations to Children's Interests to Promote Meaningful Learning

Participants will learn about discovery and investigations through the input of young children. Teachers can promote 21st century learners by utilizing children's play, interactions, problem-solving and through the use of open-ended questions and communication.

8/21/18

IT's SIDS

This workshop addresses safe sleep practices and ways to reduce the risk of SIDS; including information on the NC Law regarding safe sleep practices in child care programs. This training meets the licensing requirement for training on SIDS.

9/6/18 & 9/13/18

NC Foundations for Early Learning & Development (NC FELD) Part 1 & 2

Participants should bring a copy of the *Foundations* book to class. This course will provide an introduction to NC's new *Early Learning and Development* expectations, how they are structured and how to implement them in early childhood settings through classroom planning and practice.

9/7/18

Child Care Director's Luncheon – Film Screening & Facilitated Discussion of *Resilience: The Biology of Stress & the Science of Hope*

Researchers are developing a new understanding of the effects of abuse and neglect during childhood. As the new documentary *Resilience* reveals, toxic stress can trigger hormones that wreak havoc on the brains and bodies of children, putting them at greater risk of disease, homelessness, prison time, and early death. *Resilience*, however, also chronicles the dawn of a movement that is determined to fight back. Trailblazers in pediatrics, education and social welfare are using cutting edge science and field-tested therapies to protect children from the effects of toxic stress – and the legacy of a childhood no one would choose.

9/10/18

Family Child Care Home Meeting - Film Screening & Facilitated Discussion of *Resilience: The Biology of Stress & the Science of Hope*

9/11/18

Adult, Child & Infant CPR & First Aid
Participants in this workshop will earn American Heart Association certification in Adult, Child, and Infant CPR, as well as training on use of AEDs along with First Aid training. Both are valid for two years.

9/17/18

Administration of Medication in Child Care (1 Hour Overview & In-Depth Session)

The first 1 hour overview will teach participants medication best practices in early care and education including receiving, documenting, storage and disposal. They will learn about NC Child Care regulations, types of medication and the forms that are required to be completed before giving medication. They will also learn how to recognize, respond to and report a medication error. The in-depth session will cover the six rights of medication administration, the steps for receiving, preparing, administering and documenting medication. The skills needed to safely administer different types of medication to children, the most common medication errors and rule violations will also be discussed.

9/18/18 & 9/20/18

Managing Challenging Behaviors Training Series: Module 3 of 3 – Teaching Strategies for Addressing and Preventing Challenging Behavior. Pre-requisites include Module 1 & 2 (Must attend both sessions and strongly encouraged to attend all 3 modules)

Ever wonder what's the most important thing we should be teaching in preschool? While teaching shapes, colors, 1:1 counting skills, and alphabet and numeral recognition/formation is at the top of most teachers' lists, research shows that teaching children social-emotional skills should be the focus of every curriculum plan. Instead of telling children what not to do, let's take time to teach children what to do! This session will identify everyday tools and techniques teachers can use to strengthen preschoolers' social-emotional competencies resulting in increased kindergarten readiness.

9/24/18

Sanitation 101 "Help! The Health Inspector is Coming."

Knowing how to meet sanitation guidelines is important for the health and safety of the children, as well as, for meeting the goal of having superior inspections. Participants in this workshop will explore the reasons why it is necessary to kill germs in the classroom; discuss the proper procedures for mixing bleach solutions, as well as, cleaning the diaper changing station, table tops, and mouthed and soiled toys; and learn to identify hazardous materials and how to store them.

9/25/18

Fire Safety

Participants will learn strategies for prevention of fires, as well as how to keep children and staff safe in the event of a fire in a child care facility. This workshop meets the requirement for annual fire safety training.

RCPC's Child Care Resource and Referral Workshop Registration Policies

Pre-registration by the published deadline is required for all CCR&R workshops whether there is a fee or not. We suggest that you call our office to ensure that enough spaces are available in the workshop that you would like to attend prior to sending payment. **Spots cannot be reserved without payment. Therefore, your registration is not confirmed until payment is received.** There are several options for registering for workshops:

Returned Checks- In the event a check is returned for insufficient funds, RCPC will charge a return-check fee based on the fee charged to RCPC by the bank. This fee and the check amount must then be paid in cash or with a money order. No further checks will be accepted from the individual or business until the charges have cleared.

Registration Deadlines - Training registration deadlines are one week prior to the workshop unless otherwise noted. Payment must be received by 5:00 pm on the deadline. Registrations will not be accepted after the deadline. The minimum number of participants required to hold a workshop is typically 1/2 of the maximum capacity. If registration does not meet this requirement by the deadline, the workshop may be cancelled and credit for a future workshop will be issued to those registered.

Training Credit Vouchers – If using a training credit voucher, the original voucher must be presented at the time of registration. Vouchers can be hand delivered or mailed to RCPC. Faxed copies of vouchers cannot be accepted. Vouchers will not be accepted after their expiration date. Facilities are welcome to use the voucher towards any staff members' registration.

Waiting List - If a workshop is full prior to the registration deadline, a waiting list will be created. If cancellations are made, we will contact individuals on the waiting list in the order their registrations were received to offer a slot in the workshop. Anyone enrolled in a workshop from the waiting list will have 24 hours to pay the registration fee to confirm their space.

Registration Cancellations - Individuals who are registered for workshops and need to cancel their registration must call our office by 12:00 pm on the day of the training in order to receive a credit for future workshops. No refunds will be given.

Late Arrivals – Plan to arrive a few minutes prior to the workshop's start time to allow time for registration. Participants arriving more than 15 minutes late or leaving more than 15 minutes early will not be given credit.

Child Care - Child care is not provided at our workshops. Because it is inappropriate to expect young children to sit quietly through workshops designed for adults, individuals who bring children with them to training will not be admitted and no refund or credit will be given.

Training Locations - Workshop locations vary. It is the participant's responsibility to ensure that they get to the proper location on time. Most training's are held at the following locations: Rockingham Community College ADT – Advanced Technologies Bldg. (bldg. with computer lab/auditorium), the Agricultural Extension Office or the Rockingham County Partnership for Children Conference Room.

Materials Given - On occasion, professional resources or classroom materials may be given to participants as door prizes or as a part of participation in the session. It is the perspective of the CCR&R that the materials should belong to the person or organization that paid the registration fee. In the event that the facility paid the fee, the materials should be made readily available for use by the staff person(s) who attended the session.

Certificates - Always keep a copy of your certificates for your own records in addition to giving one to your employer. There will be a \$5 fee for RCPC staff to provide a replacement certificate for trainings attended within the last year only.

Inclement Weather – If Rockingham County Schools are closed due to inclement weather on the same day that a workshop is scheduled, the workshop will be postponed and rescheduled later.
